

### IN TRIBUTE TO DSP CRAIG WHITE



It is with deep sadness that we share the passing of our colleague and friend, Craig White, who tragically lost his life in a car accident after completing his shift at Cedar Street.

Craig was more than a Direct Support Professional; he was family to the individuals and staff he worked with. His presence brought comfort, stability, and joy. He was fully present on shift, taking the time to sit with our individuals and do puzzles, encouraging them as they learned new skills, helping them put on their shoes, and making sure they were ready for outings. He supported them with their daily needs, always patient and kind, never rushing, always seeing the person in front of him.

When the house needed him, Craig was there. He often picked up extra shifts, not because he had to, but because he cared. He was someone we could count on; someone the individuals could count on. He was often paired with Harry as his 1:1, and the bond they shared was filled with trust and genuine care. There will be a void in Harry's life, and in the hearts of all our individuals, that cannot be filled.

This sudden loss reminds us how fragile life can be. As we grieve, let us also honor Craig's memory by carrying forward the love and dedication he showed every day. He will remain a part of Cedar Street not just in memory, but in the way we continue to care for one another, with the same gentleness and heart that he embodied.

Please keep Craig's family and the Cedar Street team in your thoughts and prayers during this difficult time. Craig's spirit, his kindness, and the joy he brought to others will never be forgotten.

ACCES-VR is a New York State agency dedicated to helping individuals prepare for, obtain, and maintain meaningful employment. Its mission is rooted in promoting independence, self-sufficiency, and full participation in community life. Through vocational rehabilitation services—ranging from career counseling and job placement to skills training and workplace accommodations—ACCES-VR supports people in building sustainable careers while fostering personal growth and confidence.

For Andrew, this meant more than just finding a job; it meant having the right resources, guidance, and encouragement to match his skills with an employer who valued his abilities.

At AHRC Nassau's kitchen in Freeport, Andrew's work may be behind the scenes, but his contribution is front and center in keeping daily operations running smoothly. As a dishwasher,

his role touches everything—from ensuring clean, ready-to-use cookware and utensils to helping maintain a safe and hygienic workspace. It's the kind of work that's essential yet often underestimated—but Andrew embraces it wholeheartedly.


### To Our Amazing Broadfield DSPs
